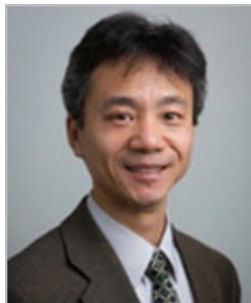

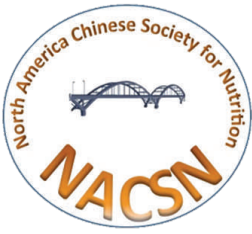
You will find these meetings as good opportunities to exchange with others and develop collaborations! We look forward to meeting with many of you then and to working with you!

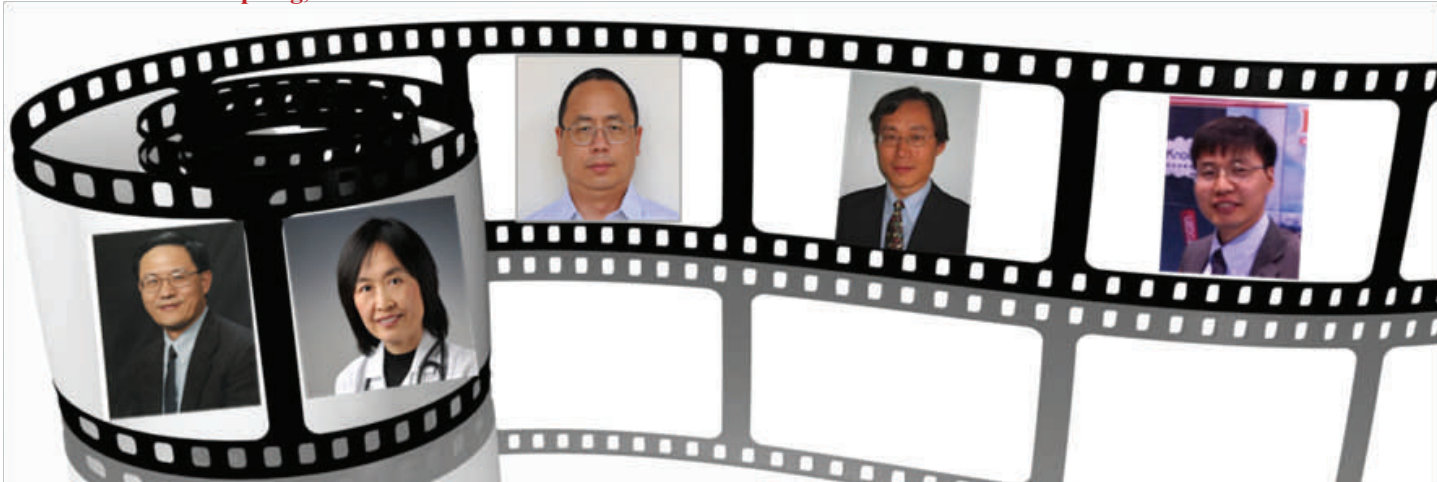

**Track 1. Obesity; Chair: Youfa Wang** [youfawan@buffalo.edu](mailto:youfawan@buffalo.edu)

Dr. Wang's research focuses on nutritional epidemiology, child nutrition and growth, childhood obesity (assessment, global trends, causes, health consequences, and prevention), chronic diseases, health disparities, lifestyles, global health, analysis of national survey and longitudinal data, and application of systems science-based methodologies in public health research.



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NACSN Obesity Interest Track (肥胖分会) has made good progress since its formation in fall 2015. We've formed the leadership team, started to facilitate related research discussion and collaboration among some members and colleagues. We have been working with the Chinese Nutrition Society (CNS) to develop the 1st China Obesity Blue Paper aiming to help promote the prevention and management of obesity and related chronic diseases and related collaboration in China (will involve a large number of top experts in China and overseas, some info will be shared during our 1st symposium and EB). <http://www.acsu.buffalo.edu/~youfawan/>

### Track 2. Diabetes; Chair: Chaodong Wu [cdwu@tamu.edu](mailto:cdwu@tamu.edu)

Dr. Wu is also the third speaker of the above NACSN webinars. His research program is to elucidate the mechanisms underlying the pathogenesis of obesity and overnutrition-associated metabolic diseases including insulin resistance, diabetes, and fatty liver disease so that novel dietary and/or pharmacological approaches can be developed for preventing and/or treating metabolic diseases. Dr. Wu has authored and co-authored over 50 research articles. Currently, Dr. Wu is funded as Principle Investigator by grants from the NIH. His latest research investigates adipocyte-macrophage crosstalk during obesity, and the protective role for adenosine 2A receptor in obesity-associated fatty liver disease. Dr. Wu is a full member of American Diabetes Association, Chinese American Diabetes Association, American Society of Nutrition, and North America Chinese Society for Nutrition.

Dr. Chaodong Wu, MD/PhD, is a tenured Associate Professor of Nutrition in the Department of Nutrition and Food Science at Texas A&M University (TAMU) (College Station, Texas) and Faculty Fellow of Texas A&M AgriLife Research. Prior to his tenure, Dr. Wu was an Assistant Professor of Nutrition at TAMU

(2007-2013), and a Research Assistant Professor of Biochemistry at the University of Minnesota (Minneapolis, Minnesota) (2003-2006). Dr. Wu received his MD from Hubei College of Chinese Medicine in 1992, Master Degree in Medical Science from Tongji Medical University in 1995, and PhD in Medical Science from Beijing Medical University in 1998. <http://nfs.tamu.edu/people/wu-chaodong/>

Dr. Wang is also the first speaker of the above NACSN webinars. He is a Professor at Friedman School of Nutrition Science and Policy, Tufts University. He is also the director of the Nutrition and Cancer Biology Laboratory and a senior scientist at the Jean Mayer USDA-Human Nutrition Research Center on Aging at Tufts University. Dr. Wang is an internationally well-recognized research scientist in the field of nutrition and chronic disease prevention, with special emphasis on how dietary components (carotenoids, retinoid, and vitamins) and other exogenous factors (e.g., tobacco smoking, alcohol consumption, high fat diet/obese and chemical carcinogen exposure) modify molecular and genetic pathways which alter the development of cancers. <http://hnrca.tufts.edu/people/scientists/q-z/xiang-dong-wang-m-d-ph-d/>

Dr. Shen's research papers include a wide spectrum of interventions, such as dietary nutrients, bioactive components, phytochemicals, herbal supplements, and exercise, in the management of musculoskeletal health including osteoporosis and osteoarthritis, plus other chronic diseases (i.e., obesity, diabetes) using cellular, animals, and humans. Dr. Xie has been studied on identifying if and how maternal diet interventions could be beneficial or adverse to normal growth and development and change offspring phenotype that might lead to disease in future life, focusing on obesity and its related metabolic syndromes and congenital heart defects. Currently, Dr. Xie is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Nutrition and Food Science at Texas A&M University. She has published 20 papers including 11 first author and 6 corresponding

author papers in journals of high impact including *International Journal of Obesity*, *Human Molecular Genetics*, *Developmental Cell*, *Journal of Biological Chemistry*, *Journal of Molecular and Cellular Cardiology*. She is the recipient of a National AHA scientific developmental grant and a NIH R15 grant on heart development.



**Jia Zhang** just received her PhD in Nutritional Sciences from Texas Tech University (TTU) supervised by **Dr. Shu Wang, MD, PhD**. She obtained BS in Food Science and MS in Nutrition and Food Sciences from Nanchang University, China. Her dissertation is NIH supported project entitled "Green Tea Nanocarriers Formulation: A Promising Approach for the Prevention and Treatment of Atherosclerosis."

Her master's projects were how different ratio of omega-6/omega-3/trans fatty acids affected lipid metabolism; formulation of functional oil for pregnant women; survey of dietary trans fatty acids intake of Chinese Population. 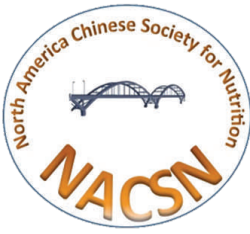
